

YONGE EGLINTON CENTRE REVITALIZATION

The project involved a vertical expansion and revitalization of the Yonge Eglinton Centre, with the new addition being reputed as the largest, single-point glass load structure in Canada - The Cube. The new three-storey structure boasts a living wall and green roof, and contains retail spaces, a galleria, and three VIP cinema theatres.

The comprehensive revitalization and redesign work encompassed the existing building from the parking levels to the fourth floor. This included the installation of new vertical transportation systems, multi-media displays, indoor waterfall features, streamlined glass balconies, and new ceilings and flooring.

The facility remained operational throughout construction, requiring off-hours work and the consistent management of noise exemption permits.

The Cube

The Cube was designed to be an open and expansive space filled with bright, natural light. Its strategic and artistic combinations of metals and glass address many of the challenges and limitations posed by the Centre's current design and immediate surroundings. The Cube is accessible from two separate buildings, as well as Toronto's pedestrian tunnel and TTC subway system.
